2017 Nations Cup Championships

York Stables and Equestrian Center LaGrange, Kentucky September 3-9, 2017

The United States Mounted Games Association is proud to host the Eighth Annual International Mounted Games Association Nation's Cup Championships at York Stables and Equestrian Center in LaGrange, Ky. York Equestrian Center is a working horse farm on 160 acres near Louisville. It has 52 stalls, wash stalls and a 250 by 400 foot all-weather arena. It is 30 minutes from Louisville where the Kentucky Derby is held.

THE COMPETITION

The competition will consist of three qualifying sessions of ten games each and two finals. The tentative schedule for the qualifying sessions and the finals are as follows:

All games will be played. All USMGA props meet IMGA standards.

Awards and Scoring

Scoring will be according to international rules

Ribbons will be awarded after the final to each rider. The Nation's Cup trophy will be awarded at the final banquet.

A. PONIES

During the competition all ponies will be stabled on the grounds under the direction of the resident Chief Barn Manager Margaret Welsby and her assistants. Feed/water/supplements will be given under barn manager direction only. Competitors should make no additions to the ponies' diet. It will be each rider's responsibility to care for the pony, the stable manager will be there to assist. We expect that you will care for the ponies in the same way that you care for your own, that stalls will be kept clean, and that ponies will be hosed off and wrapped if needed. Ponies will be stabled at the York from Sunday before the competition until the end of the competition on Saturday. Practice schedules will be posted in the arrival packet and will be in designated areas, at designated times. Ponies may be sourced from anywhere you choose but there will be pool ponies available.

A.1 Borrowing Ponies

Almost all ponies for this event will be loaned. Teams will be assigned team ponies with comparable amounts of skill, speed, experience and size. We will be using the information you send us on rider size to guide us in pony selection. Every effort will be made to properly match rider size and weight with appropriate-sized ponies. For this reason it is extremely important that you forward your rider selection to us, including weight and height, **as soon as possible**. We will have to supply up to eight teams with ponies. This would be difficult or impossible to arrange at the last minute.

A.2 Ponies at the Competition

- The competition grounds will have a large practice ring complete with props.
- Ponies will be kept in assigned stalls at York.
- Tack stalls will be allocated to teams.
- There will be a feeding and cleaning chart posted in all tack stalls for each team.
- Supplies such as buckets, forks, skills, and grooming tools will be supplied to each team.
- All tack except stirrups and leathers will be supplied.
- Barn managers and security will be on site 24 hours a day.
- Your arrival packet will include a section on what is expected in caring for your borrowed ponies as well as a detailed profile on each pony including experience, owner name and contact number, pros and cons, likes and dislikes, etc.
- There will be a veterinarian and blacksmith on call or on the grounds at all times.

B. ENTRY FEE

Since most of you will not be bringing your own ponies, entry fees cover:

- Entry fee
- Pony stall
- Tack room
- Stall bedding
- Pony feed and hay
- Cost of borrowing pony
- Cost of transporting the pony to competition grounds
- Lunch and evening meal each day from Sept. 3rd 9th
- Trip to Churchill Downs racetrack, trip to horse breeding farm and outlet mall (for team and trainer), and final banquet cruise

E. ABOUT THE UNITED STATES

- The US has extremely strict anti-drug and gun possession laws.
- Driving is done on the right side of the road. Most vehicles are automatic. Speed limits are imposed. An international driver's license is not required. The minimum driving age is 16. Most rental car companies impose an age restriction of 25 years of age. You must have a credit card to rent a car.
- Drinking age is 21 and proof of age is required in all drinking establishments. Young people will be carded. Drinking and driving strictly prohibited, if you plan to drink, have a designated driver.
- Most banks open at 9:00 AM till 5:00 PM with many banking centers open longer. Bank machines are available everywhere that are open 24 hours. Check with your bank to be sure your bank card will work in the US.
- Most transportation is by air or car. Some cities, such as Chicago, Washington and New York have good public transportation but many others do not. There are low
 airfare rates from Cincinnati and Louisville to many large cities it you choose to extend your stay and to see more of the United States.
