Mark Crowe – Elected to the role of IMGA Chief Referee, November 2023.

I came to the discipline of Mounted games in 2009-2010 when my 3 children commenced Mounted Games through the Meath Hunt Branch of the Irish Pony Club. Since then I have followed their development through this fantastic sport at all age groups in Pony club and into the Mounted Games Association around 2014.

I trained as an IMGA referee in 2016 and progressed up the ranks from 1* to 4* referee. I have refereed at a number of IMGA events including World individuals 2018, 2019, World pairs 2019, Europeans (Teams and Individuals) 2019, World Teams 2021, World Individuals 2021, World Pairs 2021, World Teams 2022, World Pairs 2022, European Teams / Individuals 2022, Nations Championships 2022, World Pairs 2023, World Teams 2023 and Nations 2023. I also referee at all Irish Competitions since 2016 and have done so at a number of MGAGB and Italian MGA competitions during that period also.

I was elected to the rules committee in November 2020 when a vacancy arose where I have actively contributed to rule changes over that period. I am a member and Chair of the IMGA training and qualification committee where we have revamped the assistant referee and full referee courses, with Liaison referees now in each country delivering these courses with input from a few of us to help when appropriate. The training and qualification committee are also trialling courses for IMGA coach development which will hopefully be an exciting initiative. My day job is reproductive biology specialist in the UCD School of Veterinary Medicine. I focus predominantly on research and teaching Veterinary Students in the areas of breeding, reproductive management and fertility treatments for cattle, sheep and horses!

I have just completed a 4 year term as Chair of MGA Ireland, thus giving me the necessary time to move to the next challenge in Mounted games for me (IMGA Chief Referee). In taking on the role of Chief Referee for 2024 to 2025 I am excited for the responsibility and trust being given to me by IMGA, as I give back the sport I have grown to love with a passion. Those who know me will be aware that fairness to the competitors is my absolute priority and I will endeavour to continue the great work of my predecessors in this role. It will be my aim to get the correct decision for the riders at all times. I look forward to seeing everyone at this years' competitions.

Rider Height and Weight Restrictions A Reminder!

Ponies GR2.1. **Ponies must not exceed 1m52cm** excluding shoes. If the referee believes a pony exceeds that height then that pony will be excluded from the competition from that point on and any points scored by the Team, Pair or Individual concerned will be lost unless: A: The rider can provide a dated height certificate for that pony signed by an independent qualified veterinary surgeon showing that the pony does not exceed 1m52cm. The height certificate must have been issued after the pony attained seven years of age or within the last twelve months for ponies under that age, or B: The referee measures the pony at the venue and is satisfied that it does not exceed 1m52cm excluding shoes.

Rule : GR2.4. The size, weight and experience of a rider must correspond to the size, build and experience of the pony. If the referee deems a rider to be overweight or unsafe, that rider will be eliminated from the competition. A rider is overweight for a pony if the rider's weight exceeds 20% of the pony's bodyweight.

An automatic calculator has been developed for IMGA by Mats Hensel to make it very easy to check the rider weight limit for your pony. **Please see MG SCOREBOARD for a calculator** In borderline cases the referee will make a decision taking all relevant factors into account. Riders should not be too tall for their pony. As a guideline the top of the pony's withers should not be more than 10cm below the level of the rider's horizontally outstretched arm.

ASSISTANT REFEREE COURSE Don't forget to sign up to the online Assistant Referee course:-

In order to maintain our high standards of refereeing, IMGA is asking that all Assistant Referees at IMGA competitions to have passed Assistant Referee training. All Assistant Referees will either have to have passed the Assistant Referee in-person course within the last 3 years or to have passed the online Assistant Referee course which is now available.

This online course has training and a set of questions. Typically it would take about 4 hours which can be done over several sessions if you prefer.

You will receive a confirmation email. Click the link. Once confirmed Click Site home. Then click IMGA Assistant Referees 2021 Then click Enrol me. Anyone certified before January 2020 will need to take the course.

WELCOME TO FONTAINEBLEAU, SAVE THE DATE ! On June 8th and 9th, 2024, the inaugural International Mounted Games competition will take place in the Parisian region.

This iconic venue, Le Grand Parquet, has been a witness to all the sporting and equestrian triumphs of the 20th century. Following a complete renovation, this event site is now modern, functional, and seamlessly blends with its extraordinary natural setting: the Fontainebleau forest. Regarded by professionals as one of the most stunning competition venues in Europe, it stands as a genuine event space.

Covering 30 hectares, the site has the capacity to welcome up to 10,000 people. In 2024, France is set to host the world's largest sporting event. Recognized as a 'Terre de Jeux' (Land of the Games), the Pays de Fontainebleau has been acknowledged by the **Olympics and Paralympics organizing** committee as a Preparation Centre for the



2024 Games in Paris.

IMGA NEWSLETTER INTERVIEW SOPHIE LOCKING



Q. In which country do you live?

Wales

- Q. What age group do you ride in for Mounted Games? I am going into my first year of under 18's.
- Q. When did you first become involved in Mounted Games?
- I started doing games when I was 4, when Paige Robinson gave me my first games pony, Fizz.
- Q. What team do you ride for?

Monmouthshire

- Q. Where have you been abroad with Mounted Games? I rode at Europeans in 2019 in Ireland. I also went to La Bonde, France in 2023 for Worlds Individuals.
- Q. What is your favourite venue? Millstreet in Ireland, as this was my first international venue and we got to parade through the streets of Millstreet. .

Q.What do you like most about Mounted Games? Making friendships that last a lifetime and watching my ponies improve.

Q. What is your favourite race? and why? My favourite race is Individual Sword Lancers, because it combines speed and precision.

Q. What advice would you give to a new Games rider? Keep working at it, and don't expect success to come overnight. If you ever get the chance to train your own pony seize the opportunity but take things slowly, as it's an incredible feeling to have success on a pony you've produced yourself.

Q. Tell us about your pony. I bought Alun in late 2021 from Elaine Trevor-Jones. She had bought him to train for Mounted Games, however, after my Windsor trail on a pony that I had produced myself, she trusted me to do the same with Alun. It took a year of basic training before I entered my first Mounted Games competition in David Broomes on Alun. After that event, I knew he was going to be something special as he showed immense potential, and took to the atmosphere very well. Since then he has become more and more confident in the ring.

Q. What other interests do you have apart from Mounted Games?

I enjoy taking part in other disciplines on my ponies such as polocrosse and showjumping. In my spare time, Alun and I love to go hacking up in the Welsh Mountains and down on the beach. Outside of riding I also play netball for my local club. However, my first love will always be riding.

Q. Tell us about your 2023 season.

The 2023 season was Alun's first complete season of Mounted games and my final year of Pony Club and under 15's. The season started well with a win with Heidi White in the STRUK Knights Bachelor Pairs, closely followed by the STRUK Individual title. We have also had a successful year riding as part of Monmouth under 15's, and I'm looking forward to riding again with them this year in under 18's. In May, I won the British Individuals after an extremely close run-off with Taryn Barker for the title. In July, my Pony

Club team qualified for HOYS by winning our Zone Final. Soon after, we travelled to La Bonde in France for a very wet World Individuals. Despite the unfavourable conditions Alun performed at his best all week, maybe we had an unfair advantage as being from Wales we are more than used to the rain. Alun exceeded all my expectations and took the under 15's title. Standing on that podium was a dream come true for me.

Following on from Worlds, we travelled straight to Onley, for the European Championships. I was reserve for the Welsh u15's team and was competing in the Individuals on Alun. This was a big ask for Alun after a tough week at Worlds, but he showed no signs of tiring, winning every session on the way to the semi-final. He once again pulled it out of the bag to take the European title.

My trainer, Rachel Dowdeswell was by my side throughout these two weeks, and I couldn't have done it without her support and belief. October brought HOYS, and the end of a very long, but very successful season for Alun and me.
